Emergency Motion <u>Dublin City Council</u> March 3rd, 2020

The elected members of Dublin City Council call on the incoming Government to urgently introduce a minimum two-year residential rent freeze in Dublin City.

This motion is an emergency for the following reasons:

- Private rental costs continue to spiral in Dublin City, average rents in Dublin City are in excess of €2,000 and increasing rents continue to drive people into homelessness where in Dublin City there are more than 4,000 homeless.
- Sinn Féin's Rent Freeze Bill passed 2nd stage in the Dáil in December 2019 but was not enacted into law
- Talks to form a new government are on-going and will result in no one party ruling alone
- Elected members of Dublin City Council believe it is important that whichever parties form a new government understand and accept that the introduction of a rent freeze for private renters in Dublin City is a critical priority for Dublin City.
