A signalised pedestrian crossing (traffic lights) is planned for this location and all works to date are 'future proofed' to allow for the installation to take place without any abortive works.

The situation is that the planning department are in a dispute with the developer in relation to their planning obligations. The pedestrian crossing forms part of these planning obligations. It is hoped that this will be settled in the next couple of months but until this is settled no further work can be carried out at this location.
