

### **Corpus Christi Hall**

Young girls in Corpus Christi NS and the local community need access to their school hall. Following my representations to the Minister for Education, Norma Foley TD, there have been positive developments to re-open Corpus Christi Hall in Drumcondra. Stakeholders are engaging to divest the hall to the trustees of Corpus Christi NS. I continue to work with the school, local community, Department of Education and others to reopen the hall at the earliest opportunity.



Since my last newsletter keys to new homes have been given to tenants on Benburb Street, O'Devaney Gardens, Dominick Street, North King Street, Ballybough and Cabra. There are 1,000+ new social homes currently under development locally.

The fastest and most sustainable way to increase housing supply is to reuse existing vacant properties. I secured Government approval for a Vacant Property grant in Dublin City. The Croí Cionnaithe grant provides €30,000 to convert vacant properties and €50,000 to convert derelict properties into homes.

4 ways to make home ownership more affordable:

Help to Buy scheme gives you €30,000 tax refund towards a deposit.



First Home Scheme 1 provides up to 30% of the cost of your new home as Government equity. Visit



**Local Authority Home Loan** provides a 90% low-interest state backed mortgage.

enables you to buy a home at a 20% reduction.



I am founding director of a youth service, youth diversion programme and a mother.

My commitment to supporting young people to reach their full potential informs all my work. We have reduced the cost of childcare, education, public transport, healthcare and secured funding for dedicated youth services, clubs and schools in Dublin Central.





We all should feel safe where we live and work. Increased anti-social behaviour on public transport and in public spaces is unacceptable. As a director of a community policing forum and public representative, I work closely with Gardaí to make our area safer. The reopening of Fitzgibbon Street Garda Station was a big win for our community. We need greater garda presence on our streets and on public transport. I am working to secure greater garda presence in our area from the increased Garda recruitment. In the meantime, please help make our area safer by reporting any suspicious activity to 999.



lam painfully aware of how underserved women have been by our health service for decades. Within Fianna Fáil I am working to change and improve womens health services. We have produced the first womens health policy and secured unprecedented funding for women's health. Free contraception is giving young women independence and autonomy never experienced by previous generations. The opening of a dedicated Menopause and new gynaecology clinic at the Rotunda is providing women and GPs with expert women's health care. Additionally, I continue to work with the Rotunda and the Minister for Health to deliver a new Westwing critical care unit on Parnell Square.



Na Píobairí Uilleann on Henrietta Street is home to "the sound of Ireland" where the teaching and making of uillean pipes is taught. I am working with Na Píobairí Uilleann to secure Government funding to construct an International Uilleann Piping Centre.



#### Gaelscoil Choláiste Mhuire

After decades of campaigning it was great to welcome Minister for Education Norma Foley to visit Gaelscoil Choláiste Mhuire in their "temporary" facilities on Parnell Square. Following the Minister's visit the build went to tender. I am now working to get the Department of Public Expenditure to approve funds so building can commence on Dominick Street.

### Fruit & Veg

Part of the Government granted €120million Urban Regeneration funding for the north inner city is being used to fund a conservation who are working to enable the reopening of the Fruit & Veg Market.

### **Moore Street** National Monument

The Minister for the Office of Public Works must commence construction of a 1916 Commemorative Centre at the National Monument, 14-17 Moore Street. The state must take urgent action to recognise our history, regenerate the street and reverse the decline.
